6	Outdoor Outreach	To support the costs of relocating to a new office and warehouse called Basecamp that will promote impactful youth programs that encourage youth to explore their world, cultivate belonging, and discover what they are capable of. Funds will support the renovations of this new space located in the Midway District with open space for staff to plan and coordinate adventure programs, conference rooms for large and small program meetings, conference room tables and chairs, a washer and dryer, an updated kitchen, and new computers and standing desks.	\$30,000
7	Rotary Club of Carlsbad, California. Incorporated	To support the cost of 200 car seats for Marine Families who are in need.	\$25,000
8	San Diego Alpha Foundation	To support the costs of the MLK Parade and 5k Walk/Run and Festival with the purchase of printing, copying and video of parade flyers, T-shirts, trophies and medals, magazine and ad book, banners and signage, yard games, and canopies.	\$20,000
