The attached table lists the approved allocations for the Community Enhancement Program (Org 12900) to be used for the purposes listed pursuant to Board Policy (B-58). Our office certifies that the organizations listed below meet the program eligibility requirements approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 13, 2023 (24).

Recommendation	Organization	Purpose	Allocation
1	City of Del Mar	To support Phase 3 of the River Path extension project with the costs of preparation and coordination of required environmental surveys and studies as required by the resource agencies permitting the project. This project will create non-motorized access to Grand Avenue Overlook from Crest Canyon Reserve Trail and enhance access to outdoor recreation opportunities such as walking, bird watching, photography, and education.	\$10,000
2	Coronado Chamber of Commerce	To support the costs of county health permits and health needs for the Coronado Art & Wine Festival with the costs of health and food permits as well as rentals for sinks, sanitizers, porta potties and paper goods. This festival helps promote economic growth and showcase and promote local businesses.	\$10,000

3	Coronado Floral Association, Inc.	To support the costs of the Coronado Flower Show with the costs of marketing, design, and printing and staff salaries for graphic design materials. Funds will also go to event rentals such as movie project and screen rentals, as well as hand-tied bouquets. The Coronado Flower Show stimulates tourism and the local economy as well as promotes horticulture and design knowledge-sharing and creates jobs through volunteerism.	\$7,500
4	North County Philanthropy Council, Inc.	To support the cost of a Marketing Specialist as well as events including NCPC Volunteer Awards Celebration, Mentorship Program, and San Diego Gives with the costs of staff salaries, as well as facility rentals. These events help NCPC in achieving their mission of bringing together all sectors involved in philanthropy who work together to strengthen philanthropic impact for positive change for San Diego communities.	\$5,000
5	Ocean Beach Merchant's Association, Inc.	To support the 44 th annual Ocean Beach Street Fair & Chili Cook-off with the costs of permits, staging and AV rentals, murals, and bike valets. This event will help in achieving the mission of OBMA to promote and support local business and economic vitality in the Ocean Beach community.	\$7,500
6	The Point Loma Rotary Club Endowment Fund, Inc.	To support the Ride the Point Jim Krause Memorial Charity Ride for pancreatic cancer research with the costs of promotional materials including newsletters, fliers, posters, banners, merchandise, shirts, and medals as well as support services such as EMS, security, and announcer. Funds will also support rider support including porta-potty rentals, rails, signage, and route markers. This ride enhances the community by providing family friendly bicycle rides that highlight the natural beauty, historical sites, recreational opportunities, and healthy lifestyle for San Diego County which help	\$7,500

		in the Rotary's mission of providing humanitarian service and help build goodwill and peace.	
7	San Diego Chinese Historical Society and Museum	To support Chinese history and culture education as well as an exhibit for famous poet Qu Yuan with the cost of staff salaries as well as materials to create the exhibition. These programs for schools are designed for schools, libraries and community groups at museums, classrooms, and remote videos to promote Chinese history and culture for San Diego County.	\$5,000
8	San Diego Regional Chamber of Commerce	To support the chamber's office of International Business Affairs with the costs of staff salaries to support efforts to solve ongoing regional challenges and lead and coordinate regionally focused economic growth activities to strengthen cross-border business development, increase inter-regional trade and collaboration opportunities, and increase access to a skilled binational workforce.	\$20,000
