7	San Diego Youth Symphony and Conservatory	<p>The mission of San Diego Youth Symphony and Conservatory is to instill excellence in the musical and personal development of students through rigorous and inspiring musical training experiences.</p> <p>Funds will support the Childhood Introduction to Music Education, with Smiles (ChIMES) and Music Discovery programs with the costs of staff salaries and facility rentals.</p> <p>Funding is in the public interest because these innovative early education programs are fully interactive, making musical instruction a vehicle for early childhood development and improving school readiness.</p>	\$10,000

<p>Amend the purpose of the 12/20/2023 (D3-13) allocation of \$50,000 to Partnership for a Better San Diego from the Community Enhancement budget (Org 12900) to include staff development and training costs (e.g. conferences, certifications, administrative costs such as fees for our grant writer, attorney and bookkeeper, etc.) and overhead costs including equipment, utilities and insurance policies for their hiring hall, food pantry and hotel apprenticeship programs. Funding is in the public interest because the nonprofit will use the funds to provide job training and work opportunities for individuals. Authorize the Director, Office of Economic and Governmental Affairs to amend the grant agreement accordingly.</p>
