Our office certifies that the organizations listed below meet the program eligibility requirements approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 13, 2023 (24).

1	Assistance League of Rancho San Dieguito	To purchase clothing and shoes for low-income families. These funds will fulfill the organization's mission of providing shopping events at a local retail store for elementary and middle school students within our region by allowing for the purchase of clothing. Representatives of the organization attend events to ensure funds are used for the intended purpose.	\$15,000
2	Black San Diego Empowering Our Community	To support the cost of speakers, speaker stands, mics, mic stands, large tents, medium tents, sound equipment monitors, CVJs, screws, wood and planks, t-shirts, signage, blankets, steel rods, steel fabricator, yarn, fabric, paint, paint brushes, coloring books, crayons, tables, chairs, generator, digital mixer, amplifier, lights, water jugs, wagons, digital camera, tablet, tape, scissors, umbrellas. These funds would support the Music and Arts in the Park Summer series at Waterfront Park.	\$11,000
3	City of Del Mar	To support the cost of project	\$25,000

This capital project will create non-motorized access to Grand Avenue Overlook from Crest Canyon Reserve Trail and enhance access to outdoor recreation opportunities such as walking, bird watching, photography, and education.	
4	Encinitas Friends of the Arts	To support the cost of face paint, decorations, cleaning supplies, t-shirts, sugar skulls, candy, event banners, paper for event posters, parking signs, crepe paper, canopies, laptop, color printer and ink. This project would support their Annual Dia de los Muertos celebration to honors and fosters an awareness of, and appreciation for, local Latino residents and Latino culture.	\$15,000
5	Encinitas Rotary Club Foundation	To support the one-time cost of hosting their charity wine and food festival to allow for the purchase of signage, banners, posters, poster cases, poster protective corners, banner frames, sandwich boards, perimeter security tape, decorations and centerpieces, signage supplies and hardware, imprinted canopies, table cloths feather flags, wristbands, radio headsets, wireless mic and cables, site flood lights, eco plates, napkins, cups, spoons, bowls, glasses, first aid kit, cart cleaning, duct tape, zip ties, name tags/sharpies, stanchion repair parts, revamp wine festival website, usb drives, poster and postcards. These funds will support the organization's mission service above self with open minds for new service opportunities while having fun.	\$10,000
6	The Environmental Health Coalition	To support the cost of visibility kits, tablecloths, canopies, banners, spinning prize wheel, sign holders, as well as environmentally friendly branded items like reusable cutlery and water bottles, Environmental Health Coalition branded hats. These funds would help advance the organizations goals of reducing pollution, and increased resident engagement in community solutions.	\$10,000

To support the cost of repairing the historic bridge, fence sections, railings, staircase, as well as materials to mitigate soil erosion and purchasing of barriers. This project would support the Friends of Coast Walk Trail’s mission to diligently engage in trail restoration efforts and enhance accessibility and safety of the Coast Walk Trail.	\$20,000
8	League of Wives Memorial Project	To support the cost of purchasing the statue of the memorial statue in Coronado to honor Mrs. Sybil Stockdale and the League of Wives for playing a major role in both local and national history. This funding will support the organization’s mission of establishing this memorial statue and bringing awareness to the League of Wives history.	\$25,000
9	MiraCosta College Foundation	To support the cost of 3D printers, laser cutters, milling machine, tabletop machinery such as drills, saws, safety equipment, and other essential tools. This project would provide essential support for the establishment of makerspace to advance innovation, learning, collaboration, and growth in the technology and engineering fields.	\$20,000
10	Serving Seniors	To support the costs of urgent roof repairs for low-income seniors, and the purchase of an Artic Container to increase senior meal capacity. This funding will support the Serving Seniors’ mission to provide urgent relief and a consistent source of nutrition to low-income seniors in San Diego County.	\$10,000
11	Vehicles for Change San Diego, Inc.	To support the cost of laptops, charging cart, virtual reality headsets, shop equipment, clothing, boots, and tools for the Vehicles for Change San Diego’s Expansion Project. This expansion project helps fulfill Vehicles for Change San Diego’s mission to continually support and serve low-income families in need of transportation.	\$10,000
12	Voices for Children	To support the purchasing of flyers, brochures, video, and marketing material. These funds will support the organizations mission of ensuring transitional age youth in San Diego County foster care system would	\$10,000
