La Jolla Women's Foundation Club, Inc.- minor alterations to an existing structure, find that they are exempt from CEQA review pursuant to Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines. Agree that more detail is needed as this will help with the CEQA and public purpose findings.

Meals-On-Wheels Greater San Diego, Inc. - Find that the construction of kitchen facilities is the minor alteration of an existing structure and/or minor new construction exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 & 15304 of the CEQA Guidelines.

The North Coast Repertory Theatre, a Nonprofit Corporation - Find that the replacement of seating in an existing theatre is a minor alteration exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.

Ocean Beach Woman's Club - Find that the alteration of an existing structure to, among other things, add air conditioning and A/V equipment is exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.

Rancho Sante Fe Seniors - Find that the minor alteration of an existing structure to add things like awnings and temperature control is exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.

Reuben H. Fleet Science Center - Find that the installation of fire suppression equipment in an existing structure is exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.

The San Diego Art Institute dba Institute of Contemporary Art San Diego - Find that the expenditure of funds for building upgrades such as for AC is the minor alteration of an existing structure exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.

Walter Munk Foundation for the Oceans - Find that the repair of an existing play structure is a minor alteration exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.
