Our office certifies that the organizations listed below meet the program eligibility requirements approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 13, 2023 (24).

1	Campana Studios	<p>The mission of Campana Studios is to create platforms for artists to engage and uplift communities as well as fulfill their mission of creating art programming, for adult and youth workshops and public art projects and collaboration with other organizations.</p> <p>Funds will support Campana Studio's visual arts workshops and youth programming with the purchase of relief printmaking supplies, painting materials, and drawing supplies, bookbinding materials, and journaling supplies, and sculpture supplies. Funds will also support the creation of a large public mural with the purchase of paint and printmaking and drawing supplies. Capital improvements will also be made at the existing 809 Academy Drive Studio with interior build out including framing, drywall, paint, flooring, and electrical as well as office equipment such as desk, chairs, tables, and couches.</p>	\$40,000

2	Carlsbad Rotary Association	<p>The mission of the Carlsbad Rotary Association is to unite community to take action to create lasting change locally and around the globe.</p> <p>Funds will support the Wine Vine Uncorked annual event with the cost of acquiring promotional materials including posters, banners and stands, framers, wristbands, decorations, and flyers as well as glassware, polo shirts, corkscrews, water buckets, belly bars and table skirts, AV speakers and sound boards.</p> <p>This charity Wine Vine is in the public interest because the event draws people to the region and brings the community together. The event is also used to promote other important community services such as for the homeless, low-income families, youth, veterans, mental health services, environmental, and educational.</p>	\$10,000
3	Del Norte High School Athletic Booster Club	<p>The mission of the Del Norte High School Athletic Booster Club is to provide increased opportunities to help bridge the gap between the increasing cost of education and sports.</p> <p>Funds will support the costs of facility updates including new weight room flooring, platforms, and weight racks as well as a high jump pit kit and pole vault pit kit.</p> <p>These updates are in the public interest because they will help with player safety, injury prevention, health, education, athletic training, and will help foster school and community pride.</p>	\$15,000
4	Del Norte High School Music Boosters	<p>The mission of the Del Norte High School Music Boosters is to provide visual and performing arts opportunities to over 255 students across 14 instrumental ensembles.</p> <p>Funds will support the costs of painting and wrapping the Boosters semi-trailer and small hitch trailer with school and program logos.</p>	\$11,000

		The updates to these trailers which are used year-round will help to preserve the trailers, promote the Program, and leverage other community sponsorships and donations for the band boosters.	
5	I Love a Clean San Diego	<p>The mission of ILACSD is to advocate for the environment and sustainability and engaging all San Diegans to be environmental stewards and take an active role in beautifying their communities.</p> <p>Funds will support the Clean Beach Coalition with the purchase of acquiring bins, labels, printing, and educational signage, bin liners, and shoreline sweeps.</p> <p>This Coalition serves as the only preventative program for capturing excess beach and ocean pollution in Mission Beach and Bay and Pacific Beach and blends environmental protection with workforce development with its partnership with other non-profits.</p>	\$10,000
6	Jewish Family Service of San Diego	<p>The mission of JFS is to address the immediate and long-term needs of diverse populations without regard to religious affiliation, empowering people of all ages and backgrounds to overcome challenges, set goals, and build more stable, secure, and connected lives.</p> <p>Funds will support Nutrition Services and Safe Parking Programs with the purchase of a shade structure, food for distribution to those in need, cookware supplies for classes, a computer setup, manual pallet jack with scale, and commercial microwaves and deep freezer chests.</p> <p>Funding is in the public interest because the Nutrition Services and Safe Parking Programs provide critical support to San Diegans without regard to religious affiliations who are working their ways to more stable futures. help</p>	\$30,000

8	Mission Beach Town Council, Inc.	<p>The mission of the Mission Beach Town Council is to ensure the health, safety, beautification, and economic growth of the Mission Beach neighborhood and consists of individuals committed to the betterment of the community with initiatives aimed at enhancing the quality of life for all.</p> <p>Funds will support the purchase of updated gym equipment and machines at the Santa Clara Recreation Center.</p> <p>Funding is in the public interest because replacing outdated machines with newer equipment will promote better public health and well-being for residents and visitors.</p>	\$25,000
9	Pacific Beach Town Council, Inc.	<p>The mission of the PAESAN event and the Pacific Beach Town Council is to support the general betterment and beautification of the community of Pacific Beach and the promotion of the welfare of the residents of the community for mutual benefit.</p> <p>Funds will support the costs of Trauma Kits for the Norther Division first responders as well as support the renovations of the Olney Community Storefront for non-emergency police assistance and the community. Renovations to this storefront include painting the exterior and all interior rooms, replacing flooring and window coverings, additional</p>	\$35,000

<p>Walter Munk Foundation for the Oceans – Find that the minor alteration of an existing space to place a sculpture is exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.</p>
