The attached table lists the approved allocations for the Neighborhood Reinvestment Program (Org 15660) to be used for the purposes listed pursuant to Board Policy (B-72). Our office certifies that the organizations listed below meet the program eligibility requirements approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 13, 2023 (24).

Recommendation	Organization	Purpose	Allocation
1	Community Resource Center	To support the cost of new office furniture and furnishings including tables, desks, chairs, couches, and cubicles for its new satellite office in Carlsbad. This new Trauma Recovery Center will help address community priorities of reducing homelessness, expand access to mental health services for people in crisis, and improve access to justice which helps in CRC's mission of helping neighbors create paths to healthy food, stable homes, and safe relationships.	\$20,000
2	Del Norte Football Touchdown Club Inc.	To support the costs of football equipment including JAX Tacklers, crash pads and tackle wheels, football pants, and shoulder pads to maintain safety and prevent injuries, which will further enable the educational opportunities for its student-athletes, as well as help foster school and community pride.	\$10,000

3	Family Health Centers of San Diego, Inc.	To support the Mobile Screening Unit Program with the purchase of a mobile mammography vehicle to increase community awareness of and access to breast cancer prevention services. This new vehicle will help FHCS D in its mission of providing caring, affordable, high-quality health care and supportive services to San Diego County residents.	\$10,000
4	Kyoto Symposium Organization	To support the Kyoto Prize Symposium event with the costs of printed programs and other printed and promotional materials as well as the purchase of a video summary of the event to share with partners who cannot attend the event in person. This event is a celebration of the lives and works of those who have made significant contributions in the fields of technology, science, and arts which helps in achieving the Kyoto's Symposiums mission of promoting education.	\$10,000
5	Liberty Station Improvement Association	To support the costs of honoring the Medal of Honor winner, John Finn with moving and installing a bronze memorial plaque and adding a bench in Liberty Station to a more accessible and visible location. Funds will also support the costs of installing a permanent canopy at the historical exhibit, the USS Recruit to protect visitors from the elements. The Liberty Station Improvement Association strives to preserve and highlight the rich military history of the Liberty Station area for San Diego County residents and visitors.	\$20,000
6	Lifeline Community Services and Economic Development Corporation	To support the costs of replacing HVAC units at their Oceanside office which is the hub for lifeline's youth-serving programs. Lifeline strives to help low-income youth and families achieve self-reliance.	\$10,000
7	Mission Bay High School Band Boosters	To support the purchase of brass, woodwind, string, and percussion instruments to benefit students across all skill levels. These new instruments will help Mission Bay Music in its mission of enriching and expanding its music program and continue its legacy of delivering high quality music education to students.	\$9,995

8	Operation HOPE – North County, Incorporated	To support the costs of items in shelter rooms including bunk beds, laptops, tablets, storage containers, and water bottle station. These items are necessary to maintain a clean and dignified living space for residents as well as assist with continuous and upwards mobility towards securing stable housing and helps Operation Hope in achieving its mission of providing year-round emergency shelter, case management and supportive services.	\$10,000
9	San Diego-Imperial Council, Boy Scouts of America	To support the costs of a dock at the youth camp on Fiesta Island. This dock will be a vital piece of equipment providing aquatics programming to youth as well as the safety to those swimming and will help the BSA in achieving its mission of providing programming to serve youth of all ages, genders, and socioeconomic statuses.	\$10,000
10	San Diego Food Systems Alliance	To support the San Diego County Food Vision 2030 and 3 rd Annual Gathering with the costs of printed posters, signage, and promotional materials as well as obtaining a video to highlight the event. This event highlights the Alliance’s mission of creating an inclusive network to promote collaboration, influence policy, and catalyze transformation in the food system.	\$10,000
11	San Diego Youth Symphony and Conservatory	To support the costs of obtaining marketing and other materials such as brochures and songbooks for the early childhood music education program to boost public awareness about the Chimes program. The Chimes program helps SDYS in achieving its mission of providing cradle to college music education programs throughout the community.	\$10,000
12	Scripps Health	To support the Mature Riders- Transportation Safety Program with the purchase of helmets, storage unit, pop up tents, tables, chairs, carts, cones, promotional materials, and bike safety related giveaways. This program helps Scripps in its goal of being committed to the health of our communities and reducing the number of unintentional injuries treated in hospitals.	\$30,000

Amend the purpose of the 06/13/2023 (D3 13-16) allocation of \$20,000 to San Diego County Breastfeeding Coalition from the Neighborhood Reinvestment Program budget (Org 15660) to include the creation, printing, translation and distribution of the San Diego County Breastfeeding Resource Guide and Breastfeeding Rights Cards to local families, hospitals, businesses and community based organizations with the goal of promoting, protecting and supporting breastfeeding and human milk feeding in San Diego County. Authorize the Director, Office of Economic Development and Government Affairs to amend the grant agreement accordingly.

Amend the purpose of the 05/02/2023 (D3 11-8) allocation of \$20,000 to Maritime Museum Association of San Diego from the Neighborhood Reinvestment Program Budget (Org 15660) to include the cost of restoring Medea's steam-based propulsion system. Authorize the Director, Office of Economic Development and Government Affairs to amend the grant agreement accordingly.

Find that the allocation to the Liberty Station Improvement Association to fund the installation of a small plaque and other improvements is a minor alteration of property exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.

Find that the allocation to Lifeline Community Services to fund the installation of an HVAC system in an existing building is a minor alteration of property exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.

Find that the allocation to the San Diego Imperial Council, Boy Scouts of America to fund the installation of a small dock is a minor alteration of property exempt from CEQA review by Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines.
